Course Objective

Material Covered: This elective will provide an in-depth introduction to the basic principles of Urogynecology and pelvic reconstructive surgery. Students will become familiar with multiple treatment modalities of incontinence, prolapse, and pelvic floor disorders. They will participate in clinic and surgery. They will be involved directly in all levels of patient care. Participant's level of responsibility will parallel with their desire and experience. Flexibility to design a program tailored to the needs and goals of each participant will be encouraged. Unique opportunities at UT include working directly with attending one on one in clinic.

Skills Acquired: Students will develop basic skills in the screening and diagnosis of Pelvic Floor disorders including history taking skills and physical examination. They will participate in bladder testing like Cystoscopy & Urodynamics. Students will be able to see and even do pessary fitting. Students may also have the opportunity to perform Cystoscopy. They will also have an opportunity to develop some basic surgical skills.
