Course Objective

Material Covered:

This elective will be based mainly in the Surgery Outpatient Clinic at LBJ Hospital. Regular clinics include: general surgery/vascular - 12 hours/week; breast care clinic - 8 hours/week; pediatric surgery clinic - 2 hours every other week; and minor procedure clinic - 2 hours/week.

Skills Acquired:

Students will be given an opportunity to see patients in all the above listed clinics. These will include preoperative evaluation and postoperative follow up. Extensive experience for problem-directed histories and physicals. Also, students will participate in the operative care of patients they see to provide them with longitudinal care experience.

- The opportunity to evaluate and follow many patients with common and uncommon surgical problems, which provides an opportunity to provide continuity of care.
- Weekly colorectal and breast surgery clinic: Students will have an opportunity to perform anorectal exams in the clinic and diagnose/treat a variety of benign and malignant pathology. There is also an anorectal procedure clinic (once a month) where students can participate in various anorectal procedures performed in an office-based setting.
