Course Objective

Material Covered: Common and uncommon neurological conditions in pediatric patients (ex. Epilepsy, headaches, autism, developmental delay, neuromuscular disorders, metabolic/mitochondrial disorders, genetic conditions, and other neurological symptoms). The students will spend 2 weeks in the outpatient clinics and 2 weeks on the inpatient consult service. There will be a weekly grand rounds to attend and the students will have to present at one of these grand rounds.

Skills Acquired: Obtain an appropriately focused neurological history for pediatric patients through:

- Performing complete neurological exams in pediatric patients of various ages by evaluations of cogitative abilities, motor functions, and levels of development.
- Formulate appropriate differential diagnoses and means for management.
- Understand when/why to order common neurological tests & genetic test, such as MRI's, LP's/NLS, EEG's, metabolic labs, and genetic panels.
- Recognize neurological emergencies.
