Course Objective

Material Covered:

This third-year elective will provide an introduction to clinical dermatology. Students will be exposed to clinical dermatology concepts in the outpatient dermatology clinic and through inpatient dermatologic consultations. Students will also be exposed to dermatopathology and dermatologic surgery. Students will attend regularly scheduled didactic sessions.

Specific learning objectives for this third-year elective are as follows:

By the end of this elective, the student will be able to:

- Accurately describe, identify, diagnose, and treat common dermatology disorders
- Describe the role of dermatopathology and major and minor dermatologic procedures in the practice of dermatology
- Recognize when to obtain dermatologic consultation on dermatologic issues.

Students will attend outpatient dermatology clinics and gain exposure to outpatient dermatology, primarily through observation. Students will also have the opportunity to observe dermatology surgical procedures. Students will round on inpatient dermatologic consults with the dermatology residents and staff. Students will attend and participate in journal club, dermatology lectures, and any other didactic conferences that are relevant to the diagnosis or treatment of dermatologic disorders. Didactic conferences occur M-F 8-9 am and Thursday mornings (7:45 am -1 pm). Students will be involved in clinical activities M-F from 9 am -5 pm and will not take call.

Students will demonstrate attainment of the above objectives through attendance and participation in didactic conferences and attendance at clinical assignments and participation in clinical activities.
