Course Objective

Material Covered:

This third-year elective will provide an introduction to emergency medicine. Students will learn how to generate differential diagnoses that include urgent and emergent conditions consistent with history and physical examination findings in the undifferentiated patient. Students will be introduced to basic patient care and monitoring of common acute problems in the undifferentiated patient.

Specific learning objectives for this third-year elective are as follows:

By the end of this elective, the student will be able to:

- Perform a directed history and focused physical examination on a patient
- State the scope of care (clinical presentation, initial management, and complications) for patients presenting with common emergencies (see list below)
- Develop a systematic approach to interpretation of radiographic imaging (x-ray and CT), electrocardiograms and laboratory data
- Perform basic procedures (such as venous access, phlebotomy, and suturing of simple lacerations)
