Course Objective

Material Covered:

This third-year elective will provide an introduction to the field of orthopedic surgery. Students will learn how to take an orthopaedic history and conduct an appropriate physical examination of the extremities and spine. This elective should be considered by students who have a general interest in orthopaedic surgery.

Specific learning objectives for this third-year elective are as follows:

By the end of this elective, the student will be able to:

- Take an orthopaedic history
- Perform an examination of extremities and spine
- Appropriately use of orthopaedic terminology
- Describe x-ray findings accurately
- Describe the principles of musculoskeletal care
- Discuss the principles of skeletal development
- Describe the basic principles of reconstructive joint surgery
- Describe the signs and symptoms of pulmonary embolus, fat embolus syndrome, compartment syndrome, infection, etc.
- Perform minor procedures correctly: cast application, arthrocentesis, insertion of traction pins, etc.
- Describe conditions in which orthopaedic assessment and treatment should not be delayed.

Students will attend clinical activities as determined by the resident team and will take call.

Students will attend didactic conferences as outlined below (and as appropriate for their scheduling within the elective).
