Course Objective

Material Covered:

This third-year elective will introduce students to the field of anatomic and clinical pathology. This elective will focus on general gross pathology as well as on the organization of a pathology service and pathological-clinical interaction.

Specific learning objectives for this third-year elective are as follows:

By the end of this elective, the student will be able to:

- Describe the function of the Division of Pathology of the hospital laboratory and its role in medical care
- Assist faculty and residents with autopsies; discuss cases
- Describe the procedures in surgical pathology (i.e., the gross description, dissection, and sectioning of specimens, including frozen sections)
- List the steps involved in the processing of tissue submitted for histopathologic examination (i.e., from tissue block to stained slide)
- Become familiar with the various areas of clinical pathology and the role of each in medical care

Students will attend the regularly scheduled didactic and clinical case conferences, from 1-2 hours daily. Students will spend the majority of the rotation at MHH hospital, with the option of spending a portion of the rotation at LBJ based on the preference of the student. They will concentrate on anatomic pathology for two weeks and clinical pathology for one week. While on Anatomic Pathology the student will rotate through the gross room and frozen section service, cytopathology, autopsy service, and surgical pathology subspecialty services. The introduction to Clinical Pathology will specifically include hematopathology, blood bank, as well as other aspects of clinical pathology.

Students will be expected to participate in clinical activities M-F, 8-5 pm, including daily 8am didactic conferences

Students will not take call or work weekends.

Rotation schedule will be provided at the start of the rotation.

Students will demonstrate attainment of the above objectives through attendance and participation in didactic conferences and attendance at clinical assignments and participation in clinical activities.
