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# **PROGRAM STRUCTURE**

01

### DIDACTICS

- 1. Residents are required to attend a half-day research-track didactics on the 4th Friday of every month.
- 2. Residents are required to attend a research-track journal club on the 2nd Wednesday of every month.
- 3. Research track residents are strongly encouraged to complete the "Biostatistics for clinical investigators" course, offered by the UTHealth Center for Clinical Research and EBM, by the end of their residency.

# 02 SUPPORT & FACILITIES

- 1. Residents are awarded extra educational travel days in case of winning a conference travel award or presenting an *oral* presentation in a national/international conference. The awarded extra travel days will not be counted from the regular annual educational leave (poster presentations alone do not qualify).
- 2. Assigned BBSB space for research track residents to conduct their projects with computers and appropriate software included.
- 3. Assigned HCPC space for research track residents to conduct their projects with computers and appropriate software included.

# 03 MENTORSHIP & ACTIVITIES

- 1. Each resident will be assigned a research mentor on the first year of residency.
- 2. Annual departmental Research Day, in which research track residents as well as non-research track residents are expected to participate with posters of their projects (previous or current projects).
- 3. Residents are strongly encouraged to apply for the available nationwide research awards.

# PROTECTED TIME/YEAR

1.PGY-2 year: 2 months

2.PGY-3 year: 1 day/week for the span of the year

3. PGY-4 year: up to 6 months

## 05 REQUIREMENTS & EXPECTATIONS

- 1. Residents are required to select a research mentor by PGY-1 year.
- 2. Residents are required to develop or participate in at least <u>one</u> research project that leads to a peer-reviewed publication with the research track resident being the *leading* (first) author.
- 3. Residents are expected to attend one national scientific conference annually, with encouragement to present their own work for oral or poster presentations.
- 4. Residents are expected to apply for grants (any of their choice) starting PGY-3 year (not necessarily winning).
