Policy Title: Grading Policy for the Undergraduate Program

The grading system in the Cizik School of Nursing is based on a letter grade system using A = Excellent, B = Good, C = Average, D = Below Average, WF/F = Fail and P = Pass. The mechanism for determining grades is outlined in each course syllabus.

Undergraduate students must make a grade of 'C' or better in any course before progression to the next sequence of courses.

Students who receive two grades below 'C' in any two courses, or who receive two grades below 'C' in the same course will no longer be eligible to continue in the Nursing Program. The designation of 'WF' is considered to be a grade below 'C' and is incorporated in calculating the Grade Point Average (GPA). Students will be placed on academic probation when their Cizik School of Nursing GPA falls below 2.0. Note: Undergraduate students shall have at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA to meet the GPA requirements for graduation.

Original grades remain on a student's record with a final repeated grade to be used to compute the student's GPA.

Grading System

Grade Scores: In computing grade point average per credit hour, the following scores are used: A = 4 points, B = 3 points, C = 2 points, D = 1 point and WF/F = 0 points. P (Pass) is not computed as part of the GPA. The course requirements and mechanisms for determining grades are described in each course syllabus.

Undergraduate Grading Scale:

90	-	100	=	A
80	-	89	=	B
75	-	79	=	C
68	-	74	=	D
0	-	67	=	F
