The new 2021-2022 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is here!

Beginning October 1, 2020, students may begin completing the 2021-2022 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at [Studentaid.gov](https://studentaid.gov). Students and Parents will utilize **2019** tax information to complete the 2021-2022 FAFSA. Students are encouraged to complete the FAFSA as soon as possible as some state and federal funds are offered on a first-come, first-served basis to those who qualify. Take these steps to apply:

- Step 1: Create a [FAFSA ID](#)
- Step 2: Complete the FAFSA at <https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa>
- Step 3: Resolve any outstanding To Do List items on myUTH
- Step 4: Respond to a financial aid offer on myUTH
- Step 5: Receive your aid

Financial Aid Offer

A Financial Aid Offer is the amount of financial aid assistance the school is offering you. It may contain assistance from a variety of sources such as: [scholarships](#), [grants](#), and [loans](#).

Generally, aid is divided into two categories:

Category 1: Gift Aid

Money for students that does not need to be repaid. Gift aid is usually based on academic achievement or financial need.

- ◆ Scholarships—internal/external
- ◆ Grants—federal/state

Category 2: Self-Help Aid

Money for students that must be repaid, specifically loans.

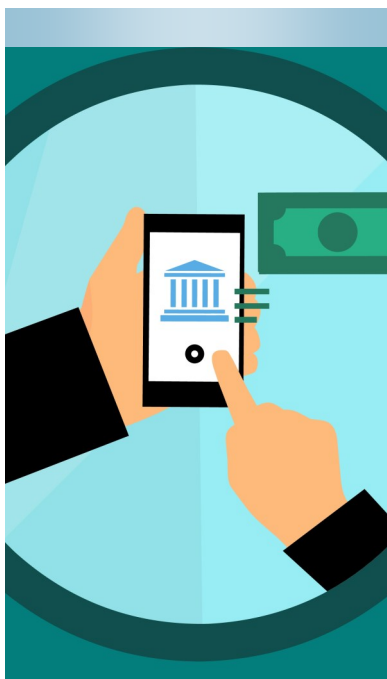
- ◆ Student Loans – Federal, state and institutional
- ◆ Private loans – banks, lending institutions

1. Log on to myUTH Student Center
2. Select Financial Aid
3. View Financial Aid
4. Choose Aid Year
5. Click Accept/Decline Awards (pencil icon)

Enroll in Direct Deposit— 2 part process

Part 1:

1. Log on to myUTH Student Center
2. Select Account Inquiry
3. Choose Account Services
4. Click on Bank Accounts
5. Add Account

Part 2:

1. Log on to myUTH Student Center
2. Select Account Inquiry
3. Choose Account Services
4. Click on Direct Deposit

Follow instructions to enter your bank account information and complete enrollment. Please allow up to 48 hours for processing.

Financial aid awards are estimated based on anticipated full-time enrollment for fall/spring terms. Pell grants will be adjusted at the end of the add/drop period to reflect your registration. You will be expected to repay any over payment of financial aid that resulted from a reduction of enrollment hours. The outstanding balance will be reflected on your university student account.

To qualify for a federal loan disbursement, students must:

- ◆ Be enrolled at least half-time in a degree-seeking program
- ◆ Meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) standards
- ◆ Resolve all HOLDS on your student account
- ◆ Have a valid Master Promissory Note (MPN) and Student Loan Entrance Counseling on file

Student loan borrowers are required to complete Loan Exit Counseling prior to graduation. Loan Exit Counseling provides important information that you will need as you prepare to repay your student loans.
